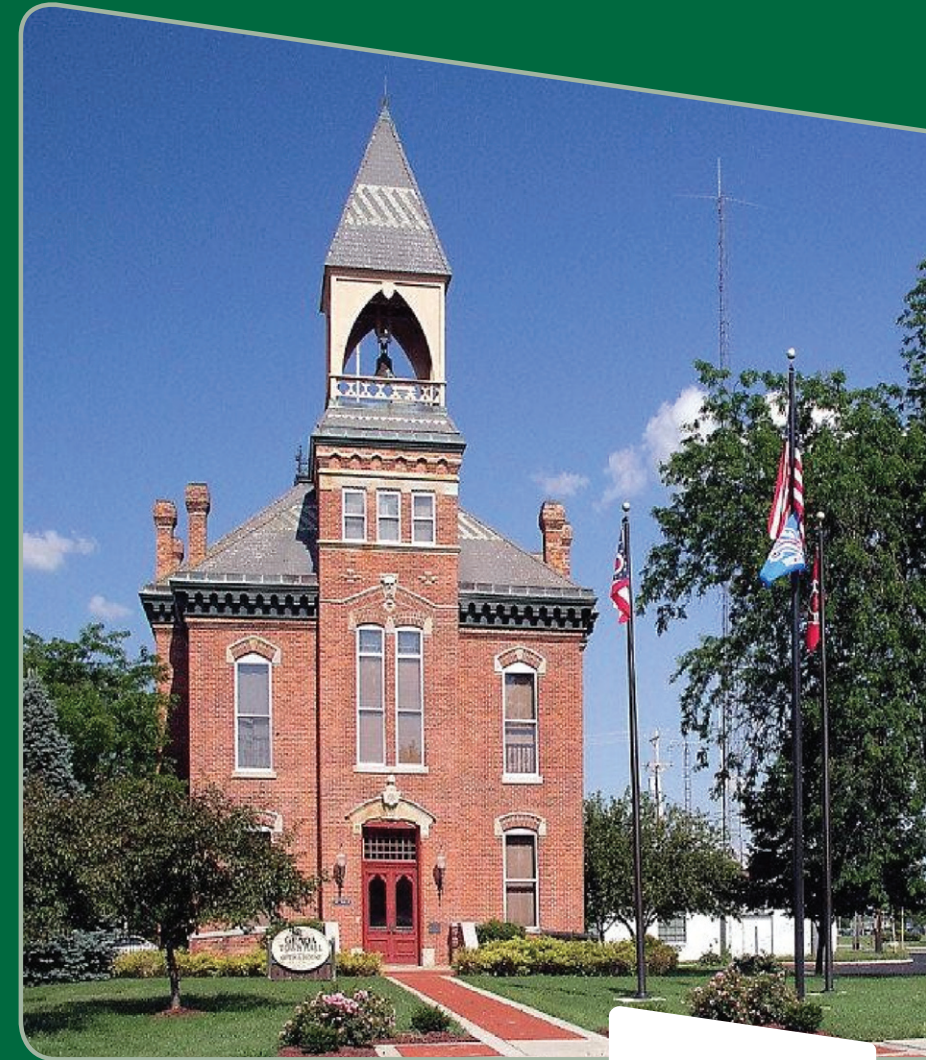

Weekly Recycling Collection! How and What to Recycle

Your recycling program has been IMPROVED – IT IS NOW WEEKLY. Starting Monday, April 6, 2009, all Genoa residents will be able to recycle WEEKLY instead of bi-weekly, as under the current program. EACH WEEK, place your recyclables out with your refuse. Use the designated 18-gallon Recycling Bin provided to you by Waste Management for all recyclable materials.

The list of items that can now be recycled includes:

- Aluminum cans
- Glass bottles and jars
- Cardboard
- Newspapers and junk mail
- Catalogs, magazines and phone books
- Plastic bottles and jugs
- Chipboard (cereal boxes, shoe boxes, etc.)
- Tin and steel cans

If you are not sure if an item goes in this bin, put it with your refuse or call the Waste Management Customer Service Center at 1-800-343-6047.

Optional Recycling Container Rental!

If you want to recycle even more than you have before, Waste Management will rent for \$1.50 per month to all residents a 64-gallon recycling cart. This will make taking your recyclables to the curb easier and prevent littering in your community. The 64-gallon cart comes with wheels and an attached lid.

Refuse Collection

Your weekly refuse service WILL NOT change. You will be allowed to set out FOUR (4) containers per week. If you need to set out more than four containers of trash, please contact the Village to purchase tags for the additional bags. Tags for refuse are \$0.80 per bag. Yard Waste may be included as part of your 4 containers. If you need extra yard waste bags, you may purchase yard waste tags at the Village office for \$2.50 per tag.

Please review the following information regarding your refuse collection:

- Place materials in their appropriate containers.
- A container is defined as any plastic or metal can 35-gallons or less in size or any plastic bag 35-gallons or less in size.
- Each pickup should consist of no more than four (4) containers, with each container not to exceed 50 lbs, including the weight of the container itself.
- Place your container at the curb the night before your scheduled pickup, or no later than 7 a.m. on your scheduled collection day. Concrete, asphalt, construction materials, etc. can never be collected with your refuse.



Optional Refuse Cart Container!

Waste Management will rent for \$3.00 per month to all residents a 96-gallon garbage cart. This will make taking your refuse to the curb easier and prevent littering in your community. The 96-gallon cart comes with wheels and an attached lid.

Bulk Item Collection

You will be able to place ONE (1) bulk item out per week. A bulk item is:

- One (1) couch, one (1) stove, one (1) mattress, one (1) boxspring, one (1) living room chair, one (1) kitchen table, six (6) kitchen chairs will be considered one (1) bulk item
- One (1) desk, two (2) end tables will be considered one (1) bulk item, one (1) washing machine or dryer, one (1) hot water heater, etc.
- Six (6) bundles of carpet, 2-feet in diameter by 4-feet in length and securely tied, is considered one (1) bulk item.

If you have an item that contains Freon (i.e. refrigerators, freezers, dehumidifiers, air conditioners, etc.), you are required to schedule the pick-up of that item by calling 1-800-343-6047 at least 48 hours in advance of pick-up. Pick-up for these items are the second WEDNESDAY of each month.

Yard Waste Collection

Yard waste materials can be placed in with your trash for collection. For example, you may have two (2) containers of trash and two (2) containers of yard waste. Yard waste includes grass, leaves and garden waste. Tree limbs will also be collected if they are bundled and tied in 4-foot lengths, are no more than 2-feet in diameter and weigh no more than 40 pounds. Bundles of tree branches are considered one (1) container. For example, you may have two (2) containers of trash, one (1) container of yard waste, and one (1) bundle of tree branches.

Christmas Trees will be picked up as part of the normal collection service at no additional charge. You may set your tree out at the curb on your collection day the week following Christmas through the second week in January. Remove all ornaments and lights, cut the tree in 6-foot lengths and place the pieces next to your bin or bag at the curb.
